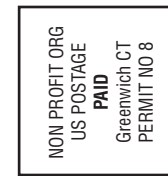

For many community programs, we partner with other organizations and town departments, providing space, publicity, and in many cases, funding for these events.

PERFORMANCE

Summer musical events organized by the Greenwich Arts Council, some cosponsored with other town organizations, offer the community musical experiences in a wide range of venues and styles. Drama programs include *Play With Your Food*, a series of noon-time events in our gallery and meeting room combining light lunches by prominent local caterers with brief, intense, often hilarious performances by a fine Fairfield County troupe.

TO THE COMMUNITY

The Greenwich Arts Council collaborates on such family events as the annual Go Fly a Kite festival and the Sand Blast beach sculpture celebration, both cosponsored with the town's Parks and Recreation Department. Town residents' contributions to the arts are recognized with programs that include annual Creative Achievement awards to high school students excelling in the visual, dramatic, musical, and literary arts, plus a series of Artist Laureate and Patron of the Arts awards for Greenwich people who have made outstanding cultural contributions.

Literary Lights is a Book Festival in two parts. It brings over twenty nationally recognized authors to the Greenwich Arts Council for a gala evening of book signings and sales. A lunch discussion with a prominent writer is held in a private home prior to the evening event, and those attending receive an autographed copy of the author's book.
