**LOUIS KAHN CONCERT BARGE IN GREENWICH
Friday, June 15, 8 pm**

New Alliance Bank, the International Festival of Arts & Ideas, and the Greenwich Arts Council have joined together in presenting a very special and unique event in Greenwich next week as Point-Counterpoint II, the ingenious floating concert hall designed by the revered 20th century American architect Louis Kahn, will be moored in Greenwich Harbor. A first-class curiosity, the Kahn symphony barge unfolds in an impressive display of hydraulic origami - musicians rising in place from below decks - to provide a bandshell for the 45-piece American Wind Symphony.

On Friday evening June 15, the public will be invited to sit along the harbor at the RBS building on Steamboat Road and enjoy a free concert provided by the American Wind Symphony. There is limited seating, first-come first-served, with grounds opening at 6:30 for the 8 pm concert. Public parking will be available at the MTA commuter parking lots at the foot of Steamboat Rd.
